### **How to Use This Booklet in Four Easy Steps**

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## **APPLICATION DEADLINE**

**All completed scholarship applications are due in your high school counselor's office by Wednesday, March 31, 2010, unless otherwise indicated.**

## **GENERAL INFORMATION**

Founded in 1992 by a group of local citizens, the Charlevoix County Community Foundation (CCCF) is a charitable organization dedicated to enhancing and enriching life for all who live in our area. CCCF accepts donations of all sizes for many charitable purposes, and manages them in a permanent endowment.

CCCF administers many types of funds, including scholarship funds that provide educational opportunities for area students. Individuals and organizations wanting to assist area students, primarily in Charlevoix County, in obtaining a college education established these funds.

We would like to extend a special *thank you* to all the generous donors who have made these educational opportunities possible for area students.

## **ELIGIBILITY**

Each scholarship fund has specific criteria that are defined by the donor when the fund is established. Use the index on page 4 to determine the scholarships for which you may qualify. More specific eligibility criteria are listed in the descriptions of the scholarships on pages 5-15.

## **APPLICATION PROCESS**

A common application form is included in the back of this booklet, and is also available on our website, [www.c3f.org](http://www.c3f.org). We encourage you to complete the application form on our website, and then print it for submission. Use this application to apply for any scholarship listed, unless otherwise indicated. You must submit a separate application form for each scholarship. The common application form may be copied as many times as necessary. Downloaded applications must be printed and submitted to your school counselor. Be certain to sign it and attach all requested materials.

You must include an original and two copies of the application and all of the required attachments for each scholarship for which you apply. Please refer to the checklist on page 16 for more details.

## **PAYMENT PROCESS FOR SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENTS**

You will be given a form to furnish to the Community Foundation with your contact information, as well as the college selection of your choice. Return the completed form to us. The Community Foundation will make scholarship checks payable to the college or university indicated on the returned form. A check will be sent directly to the school financial aid office. Scholarship amounts are based on the availability of funds and are non-renewable unless otherwise indicated.

Students may request a deferred payment for up to one year. This exception is made on a case by case basis, depending on the student's circumstances.

### **Norman and Genevieve Bartlett Scholarship**

*Norm Bartlett was a fun-loving person, born and raised in East Jordan. He was a historian, civic leader, and musician who deeply loved his family and his hometown. This fund was established in memory of Norm and will provide a \$500 scholarship to a student graduating from East Jordan High School who will major in engineering and attend either Michigan Technological University or Lake Superior State University.*

**Criteria:** Applicants will be scored on academic performance, extra-curricular school activities, community involvement, leadership and recognition awards, financial need, and a written personal statement.

### **Bay Harbor Foundation Scholarship**

*The Bay Harbor Foundation Scholarship is being offered through the Petoskey-Harbor Springs Area Community Foundation to benefit graduating seniors residing in Charlevoix or Emmet Counties, pursuing a degree at a college, university, or other postsecondary educational institution. Consideration will be given to financial need, academic performance, and community service. One \$500 award is available.*

**Criteria:** This scholarship is administered through the Petoskey-Harbor Springs Area Community Foundation. Contact Sara Ward, Program Officer, at (231)348-5820 for an application.

### **Beaver Island 21st Century Learning Scholarship**

*This scholarship is offered by the Beaver Island Board of Education to enhance the educational opportunities for graduating seniors from the Beaver Island Community School. At least one scholarship will be awarded to a high school senior who, in the judgment of the selection committee, best demonstrates competence in all five areas of the Graduate Profile as adopted by the Beaver Island Commission on Education.*

**Criteria:** The student is required to complete a Beaver Island 21<sup>st</sup> Century Learning Scholarship application, which is available from the principal's office.

### **Jeremy and Nicholas Bingham Memorial Scholarship**

*The family and friends of Jeremy and Nicholas Bingham created this scholarship as a legacy to these brothers who died tragically at an early age. This memorial fund will provide two \$1,000 scholarships to help make a college education possible for Charlevoix County students.*

**Criteria:** Graduating senior from a Charlevoix County high school who plans to attend a two or four year college. Selection will be based on financial need, school and community involvement, and a written personal statement discussing/demonstrating student initiative.

### **Becky Bos Memorial Scholarship**

*Mike and Karen Bos established a scholarship fund as a lasting tribute to their daughter, Becky Bos, who was a 1991 graduate of East Jordan High School and died at an early age. This \$1,200 scholarship is a way to help other young people achieve their educational goals.*

**Criteria:** Graduating East Jordan High School senior with a minimum 3.0 G.P.A. and demonstrated financial need.

### **Boyne City Cooperative Scholarship Fund**

*This scholarship was created by the stockholders of the former Boyne City Cooperative in memory of the coop and the service that it provided to its members. One \$500 scholarship is available to a graduating high school senior from Emmet or Charlevoix Counties who wishes to pursue a degree in Agriculture or related field (forestry, botany, conservation, environmental sciences, veterinarian, etc.). The scholarship may be renewable through completion of the undergraduate degree program.*

**Criteria:** Graduating senior from a high school in Charlevoix or Emmet Counties who will pursue a degree in agriculture or a related field of study. Consideration will also be given to a student's academic performance, financial need, extra curricular school activities, community service, and personal statement.

### **Boyne Valley Lions Club/Clive and Ruby Vollick Scholarship**

*Two scholarships are provided by a fund established in memory of Clive and Ruby Vollick, who moved to Boyne City in 1963, were community boosters, and active in the Lion and Lioness Clubs in Boyne City. One female and one male recipient are chosen each year.*

**Criteria:** Graduating senior of Boyne City Public High School with a G.P.A. in the top 30% of the class. The applicant must plan to major in business. Priority will be given to applicants who also wish to specialize in accounting. Consideration will be given to class ranking, grade point average, extra curricular activities, community volunteer activities, and awards and honors.



### **Edna Brown Nursing Scholarship**

*This scholarship was created through the estate of Ralph McRae, a former Charlevoix mayor, civic booster, and philanthropist. Ralph had a longtime admiration for the nursing profession. His mother, Edna Brown, was an unusually caring person who had a reputation for helping others, so Ralph named his fund in her memory. Scholarships will be awarded in an estimated range of \$1,000 to \$3,000 to students who have been accepted into the nursing program at North Central Michigan College. It can be applied to tuition, books and fees only. If the student is getting other scholarships or educational stipends, the Edna Brown Nursing Scholarship must only be used for last dollar funding. This scholarship is renewable pending the availability of funds.*

**Criteria:** The student must be a resident of Charlevoix or Emmet County who will be enrolled at least three-fourths-time in NCMC's nursing program. Applicants will be rated on financial need as measured by the FAFSA Student Aid Report, academic performance, and a written personal statement. Applications are available in the Student Services Office at NCMC by calling 231/348-6627. Completed applications are due to NCMC's Student Services Office by May 15. Decisions will be made by June 30.

### **Charlevoix Lions Club/Don Meggison Community Service Scholarship**

*Don Meggison was a life-long resident of Charlevoix and known for his extensive participation in community affairs. The Charlevoix Lions Club established this scholarship fund in his honor and memory. Graduating seniors from Charlevoix High School who will attend college or a vocational education program in the fall are eligible to apply. Two \$500 scholarships are available.*

**Criteria:** The student is required to complete a Don Meggison Community Service Scholarship Application, which is available in the Counselor's office.

### **Kristen Cleary Memorial Scholarship**

*Kristen was an extraordinary young woman whose talents included music composition, writing poetry and exploring different art forms. Her plans to pursue a career in art never came to fruition, due to a fatal tragedy. The Cleary family established an art and music scholarship in her memory. One \$500 art scholarship and one \$500 music scholarship are available.*

**Criteria:** Graduating Seniors from a Charlevoix or Emmet County high school pursuing a course of study in music and/or art, with a minimum GPA of 3.0, who has been accepted at a two or four year college. Along with the common application, the candidate must submit three original photos from their portfolio, and/or a recorded tape or CD of their vocal or instrumental performance to the selection committee. In addition, each student will be evaluated on their extra-curricular school activities, community service, and written personal statement. All application materials must be received at the Charlevoix County Community Foundation office, P.O. Box 718, 507 Water Street, East Jordan, Michigan 49727, 231/536-2440, by March 31, 2010.



### **Charlevoix Area Hospital Nursing Scholarship**

*The Charlevoix Area Hospital established this fund to offer nursing scholarships to students who wish to pursue a career or further their career in professional nursing. Currently, one \$1,000 nursing scholarship is available from this fund and may be renewable for a second year.*

**Criteria:** Student who lives in the hospital service area and has been accepted in a nursing program at an accredited school of professional nursing in Michigan. Consideration will be given to grade point average, personal statement, demonstrated leadership ability, extra curricular school and community activities, and demonstrated financial need. Applicant must include a completed financial statement as well as the common application form. All completed forms should be returned to Diane Kidder at the Charlevoix Area Hospital, 14700 Lake Shore Drive, Charlevoix, MI 49720 by March 31, 2010.

### **Charlevoix County Farm Bureau**

*Members of the Charlevoix County Farm Bureau created this scholarship in memory of William G. Korthase Jr., a long-time Farm Bureau member and community advocate who devoted most of his life to farming and soil conservation. This scholarship provides one award to a Farm Bureau member's child to attend college. Additional consideration will be given to a student who plans to major in a field of agricultural studies.*

**Criteria:** The applicant's parent must be a member of the Charlevoix County Farm Bureau. Additional consideration will be given to a student who plans to major in a field of agricultural studies. A special application is available in the High School counseling office.

### **Robert and L. Georgine Craig Scholarship**

*Robert and Georgine were long-time summer residents of Charlevoix who valued family, community, and higher education. This scholarship fund was established in their memory, providing two, \$2,500 awards for students to attend college.*

**Criteria:** Graduating senior from Charlevoix High School with a minimum GPA of 3.0 and minimum ACT score of 25, who has been accepted to a two or four year college. Selection will be based on academic performance, financial need, and personal statement.



### **Kenneth Diller Memorial Scholarship**

*Kenneth Diller, a long-time resident and community activist in East Jordan, placed great emphasis on the needs of young people and the importance of getting an education. This scholarship fund was established in his memory to enhance the educational opportunities for East Jordan High School graduates who will be attending a two- or four-year college in Michigan, with priority given to education majors. Currently, a \$2,500 scholarship is provided.*

**Criteria:** Graduating senior from East Jordan High School and acceptance at a Michigan two- or four-year college. Priority will be given to a student who will major in education, but equal consideration will be given to other students if an education major does not apply. Students will be evaluated on their academic performance, personal statement, extra-curricular school activities, and financial need.

### **Eary/Conrad Family Memorial Scholarship**

*The Eary family of East Jordan was a family of educators, advocating vocational education and continuing education in general for many local students. This memorial scholarship fund was named after this family of community activists and will provide a \$300 scholarship for each of the two recipients of the Michigan Association of Retired School Personnel (MARSP) Scholarship. The purpose of the scholarship is to provide financial assistance for a student who will attend an accredited trade or vocational education school or program.*

**Note:** Applicants for the Eary/Conrad Family Memorial Scholarship are automatically eligible for the MARSP Scholarship (see page 13 for details on the MARSP Scholarship). The same set of criteria and the same selection committee are used for both scholarship funds. Applicants need to submit only one application to apply for both the Eary and the MARSP scholarships.

### **East Jordan Garden Club**

*The East Jordan Garden Club supports educational opportunities for students graduating from East Jordan High School majoring in landscape architecture, horticulture, botany, forestry, environmental education, or some related field. One \$500 scholarship will be awarded to a graduating senior.*

**Criteria:** Consideration will be given, in order of priority, to: personal statement, extra curricular school activities, volunteer community activities, leadership and recognition awards, and special personal or family circumstances.



### **East Jordan Lioness Club**

*This scholarship is being offered by the East Jordan Lioness Club. It is open to graduating seniors from East Jordan High School pursuing a vocational education program, or a two or four-year degree in voc ed. Priority is given to a Lioness member's child or grandchild, although all eligible students are encouraged to apply. At least one, \$500 scholarship will be awarded.*

**Criteria:** A special application is available in the East Jordan High School Counselor's office.

### **East Jordan Rotary Club Scholarships**

*The East Jordan Rotary Club Scholarship Fund will provide scholarships of various amounts for graduates of East Jordan High School. These scholarships are named after community leaders who were interested in assisting area youth with furthering their education: William E. Malpass, Marjorie Smith, William T. Mathews, Bill Porter, Howard P. Porter, and Bryce Vance*

*The Bryce Vance Memorial Scholarship is awarded automatically to the in-bound Rotary exchange student.*

*The Bill Porter Scholarship is awarded to a student who will pursue a license, certification, or endorsement in a specialized trade, or who wishes to work toward an associates or bachelor degree in the trades and industry field. This scholarship is renewable.*

**Criteria—Bill Porter Scholarship:** Selection will be based on financial need, assessment of the applicant's personal statement, and community service.

**Criteria—All other Rotary Club scholarships:** Consideration will be given to grade point average, ACT score, college preparatory classes, school and community activities, and awards and honors.

**Note:** Students receiving more than two other local scholarship awards may not receive the East Jordan Rotary Club Scholarship that same year. In these instances, payment of the Rotary scholarship may be deferred for up to one year.

### **R. Loren & K. Hughes Scholarship**

*The Hughes have had a life-long interest in running businesses—with a successful track record. They now feel privileged to help others who have that same motivation. This scholarship was initiated to assist an East Jordan High School graduating senior who will attend a two or four-year college or university with a major in business or accounting. One \$500 scholarship will be awarded.*

**Criteria:** Applicants will be scored on academic performance, financial need, a written personal statement, and special personal or family circumstances.



### **Teddy Jeffery Memorial Scholarship**

*This scholarship fund was established in memory of Teddy Jeffery, who was an East Jordan High School graduate, a Lake Superior State University graduate, and an avid outdoorsman. This \$1,000 scholarship is awarded to a graduating senior from East Jordan High School who will attend Lake Superior State University as a full-time undergraduate student.*

**Criteria:** Applicant must be accepted at Lake Superior State University on a full-time basis to pursue an undergraduate degree. Consideration will be given to financial need, grade point average, and student involvement and service.

### **First Sergeant John D. Juracko Scholarship**

*John Juracko was a retired 1st Sergeant in the U.S. Marine Corp. At the start of a life-long career, he enlisted in the U.S. Marines during the Depression. He served in China in the years leading up to WWII, then re-enlisted and spent the next 20 years serving in active duty in various locations around the world. This accomplished soldier called East Jordan home, and set up a scholarship fund as his legacy to help young people. One scholarship will be awarded to a graduating senior who will attend North Central Michigan College.*

**Criteria:** Academic achievement, extra-curricular school activities, volunteer activities in the community, special awards and recognitions, and a 100 word essay "What America Means to Me". Nominal additional points will be given to children of parents who have served in the U.S. Marine Corp. A special application form is available at the counseling office.

**Note:** The application for this scholarship is the same application used for the Marine Corps League, Northern Michigan Detachment Scholarship.

### **Leatha Larsen Memorial Scholarship**

*Leatha Larsen, a teacher and counselor with the East Jordan Public Schools for 47 years, had a great concern for students and a strong commitment to education. She established this fund to help ensure educational opportunities for East Jordan students. One \$700 scholarship is available.*

**Criteria:** East Jordan High School graduating senior who will attend college in the fall, has financial need, and who has exhibited hard work and a strong motivation to complete college.



### **Lee-Tokoly Educational Endowment**

*The Lee-Tokoly Educational Endowment is a fund named for Henry & Elizabeth Lee, and Sam & Vera Tokoly—life-long residents of Boyne City who were active in church and civic affairs, and supporters of higher education for area students. The purpose of the fund is to provide financial assistance of various amounts for Boyne City High School graduates who wish to enroll full time in a degree program at a community college or university.*

**Criteria for Lee Scholarship:** Boyne City High School graduates who will be full-time students in a degree program at a community college or university. Applicants must have a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.0, abstain from the consumption of alcoholic beverages, and demonstrate financial need. Applicants for the Lee Scholarship automatically qualify for the Tokoly Scholarship and need not complete a separate application.

**Criteria for Tokoly Scholarship:** Boyne City High School graduate who, in the judgment of the selection committee, demonstrates leadership, unusual abilities or the likelihood that the student will make a "substantial contribution to their fellow men." Applicants may choose to apply only for the Tokoly Scholarship, if they wish.

**Note:** Common application form in this booklet is NOT used for these scholarships. Please see the Boyne City High School counselor for this application.

### **Little Traverse Association of Home Builders Building Industry Career Scholarship**

*This scholarship is being offered through the Petoskey-Harbor Springs Area Community Foundation to benefit graduating seniors residing in Charlevoix or Emmet Counties, and adults seeking to upgrade skills or pursue a career change in the building industry field. Selection is based on grades, record of work, attendance record, personal commitment indicators and a single page essay answering "Why do you want to be part of the building industry?" Experience in the building trades is a plus. One \$500 award is available.*

**Criteria:** This scholarship is administered through the Petoskey-Harbor Springs Area Community Foundation. Contact Sara Ward, Program Officer, at 231/348-5820 for an application.

### **F. Bruce Malpass Memorial Scholarship**

*F. Bruce Malpass, a life-long resident of East Jordan, was a community activist who was interested in issues related to young people and emphasized the importance of education. The F. Bruce Malpass Memorial Scholarship Fund provides a \$2,500 scholarship to an East Jordan High School graduating senior who will attend Lake Superior State University, with priority given to a student majoring in a technology related field of study.*

**Criteria:** Graduating seniors from East Jordan High School who will attend Lake Superior State University. Preference will be given to a student who majors in a technology related field of study, although the scholarship is open to students regardless of their intended field of study. Consideration will be given to school and community participation, leadership, awards, and special family circumstances.

### **Marine Corps League – Northern Michigan Detachment Scholarship**

*This scholarship fund was established by the members of the Marine Corps League, Northern Michigan Detachment to provide financial assistance for students to attend college. One scholarship is available this year.*

**Criteria:** Graduating senior from a Charlevoix or Emmet County high school who plans to attend North Central Michigan College. Consideration will be given to academic achievement, extra-curricular school activities, volunteer activities in the community, special awards and recognitions, and a 100 word essay "What America Means to Me". Nominal additional points will be given to children of parents who have served in the U.S. Marine Corp. A special application form is available at the counseling office.

**Note:** The application for this scholarship is the same application used for the First Sergeant John D. Juracko Scholarship.

### **Michigan Association of Retired School Personnel (MARSP) Scholarship (Charlevoix County Chapter)**

*This scholarship fund was established by the members of MARSP and provides two scholarships to students graduating from a high school in Charlevoix County. The purpose of the scholarship is to provide financial assistance for students who will attend a school with an accredited trade or vocational program.*

**Criteria:** Examples of areas of study include dental hygiene, nurse's aid, beautician, welding and construction trade skills, computer science and auto mechanics. Consideration will be given to work experience, personal statement, school and community service, personal interests and hobbies, and special recognitions.

**Note:** Applicants for the MARSP Scholarship are automatically eligible for the Eary/Conrad Family Memorial Scholarship (see page 9 for details on the Eary Scholarship). The same set of criteria and the same selection committee are used for both scholarship funds. Applicants need to submit only one application to apply for both the Eary and the MARSP scholarships.

### **Peggy Carey Northway Nursing Scholarship**

*Peggy Carey Northway was a 1974 Charlevoix High School graduate who had completed two years of nursing school at the University of Michigan when she was diagnosed with leukemia. This fund was established by family and friends in her memory and provides a \$1,000 scholarship, which may be renewable for a second year.*

**Criteria:** Student who lives in the Charlevoix Area Hospital service area and has been accepted in a nursing program at a Michigan accredited school of professional nursing. Consideration will be given to academics, personal statement, honors, leadership, extra-curricular school and community activities, financial need, and references. Applicant must include with the common application a completed financial need statement, and a copy of his/her FAFSA Student Aid Report. All completed forms should be returned to Diane Kidder at the Charlevoix Area Hospital, 14700 Lake Shore Drive, Charlevoix, MI 49720 by March 31, 2010.



### **Shepard Family Scholarship**

*Jim and Marie Shepard along with members of their family created this scholarship to provide educational and training opportunities for East Jordan High School graduates who will pursue a license, certification, or endorsement in a specialized trade, or who wish to pursue an associates or bachelor degree in the trades and industry field. One \$500 scholarship will be awarded this year.*

**Criteria:** A current or former graduate of East Jordan High School who wishes to continue their training or education as described above. Selection will be based on financial need, a written personal statement, service to the community and letters of reference from a voc-ed teacher, current or former employer, and one other individual who is not a member of the applicant's family.

### **Teddy Slough Memorial Scholarship**

*Teddy Slough was a fun-loving young man who demonstrated an exceptional passion and promise in the field of music. He played six instruments, participated in local jazz bands, and composed and recorded music. His love for learning and life was extensive. His life tragically ended just three days short of his graduation from the Northwest Academy in June 2004. A memorial scholarship fund was created by his family and friends to honor this talented individual. Two \$500 scholarships are being offered to help other young people achieve their music-related goals.*

**Criteria:** The eligible student must be a graduating senior of either the Northwest Academy or East Jordan High School with a demonstrated talent in voice or one or more musical instruments. Priority will be given to a student majoring in music, with secondary consideration given to a student participating in some college organized instrumental or vocal group, and/or provides instruction to others in their musical specialty. A personal statement detailing the student's past and present interest in music and how (s)he plans to advance her/his participation in the field of music in college is required. Applicant must submit a letter of reference with application from a music teacher or instructor.

### **Bob Snyder Memorial Scholarship**

*Bob Snyder, a life-long resident of northern Michigan, spent 30 years teaching business and coaching basketball, football, and track in the East Jordan Public Schools. This scholarship fund was established in his memory and provides a \$400 scholarship for an East Jordan High School graduate.*

**Criteria:** East Jordan High School graduate who will attend college in the fall, preferably Central Michigan University, and will study education or business. Consideration will be given to financial need, grade point average, school and community participation, awards, and special circumstances.



### **Choice Snyder Family Memorial Scholarship**

*Choice Snyder was a long-time resident of northern Michigan. When she died in 1991, her children established the Choice Snyder Family Memorial Scholarship Fund in her memory. This fund provides a \$375 scholarship for a Boyne Falls High School graduate.*

**Criteria:** Graduating senior from Boyne Falls High School who plans to attend a two or four year college or university. Student should have a 3.0 or better cumulative grade point average. In order to be eligible for this scholarship, applicant may not be receiving any other local scholarship awards. The recipient may defer the award until the second year of college.

**Note:** Common application form in this booklet is NOT used for this scholarship. Please see the Boyne Falls High School counselor if you are interested in applying for this scholarship.

### **Walter and Norma Thorsen Scholarship**

*Walter and Norma Thorsen were very active in the community of East Jordan. They were strong supporters of students who had an interest in the building trades. This scholarship fund was established in their memory, and a \$750 scholarship is available for an East Jordan graduate wishing to pursue a career in the building trades.*

**Criteria:** Graduating senior from East Jordan High School who wishes to pursue an advanced education or training in the trades and industry field (for example, carpenter, electrician, tool & die, plumber, welder, or other building trades) that leads to a certificate, license, technical/associates degree, or a Bachelor of Arts degree. Consideration will be given to financial need, personal statement, and letters of reference.

**Note:** Applicant must submit three letters of reference with application: one from a vocational education teacher, one from an employer, and one from an individual who is not related to the applicant.

### **Muriel and Bill Zoulek Memorial Scholarship**

*Muriel Zoulek was an avid reader, a devoted mother, and a professional nurse who lived most of her life in East Jordan. She graduated from East Jordan High School in 1929 and pursued a degree in nursing. She worked as a nurse for 42 years before retiring in 1974. One \$250 scholarship is being offered to an East Jordan High School graduate who is pursuing nursing at any level.*

**Criteria:** Must be a graduate of East Jordan High School, who is accepted at and will attend an accredited school of nursing. Consideration will be given to academic performance, financial need, special conditions, school attendance, and work history.

**Note:** This scholarship requires an attendance form be submitted with the common application. Please see your school counselor for completion of this form.

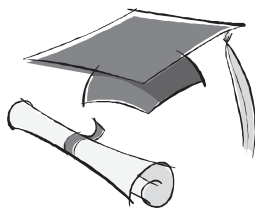
